

## Yellowknife, Canada 5 Days (Winter Season)

**Departure: Daily Departure (20 November 2019– 13 April 2020)**

### Day 1 Home Town / Yellowknife



Meet and Greet by tour guide transfer to selected hotel in Yellowknife. Yellowknife is the best location in the world for viewing the Aurora Borealis. As nights grow longer, the green, red and mauve lights of Aurora Borealis are absolutely brilliant as they dance across the sky.

4-Nights 4 stars Hotel accommodation in Yellowknife: Chateau Nova Hotel or Explorer Hotel.

### Day 2 Yellowknife – City Tour – Aurora Hunting (B)



Yellowknife sightseeing tour takes you pass through downtown area. Visit Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Center, which produces exhibitions that tell stories about the land, people, and history of the NWT. We continue to visit Bush Pilot's Monument. From the Pilot Monument viewing deck, you can enjoy views of Great Slave Lake, Back Bay, Yellowknife Bay, Old Town, Yellowknife, Jolliffe Island and Frame Lake. During the tour, you can

learn the history behind Yellowknife by professional guide. In the evening, hotel pick up and you can travel with your professional guide into the wilderness in search of the Aurora Borealis. Keep your eyes on the skies for the illusive swirls of color. After the tour, your driver will transfer you back to your hotel.



### **Day 3 Yellowknife – Dog Sledding – Aurora Viewing at Aurora Village (B/D)**



Enjoy sled through frozen lakes and trails with the fastest sled-dogs in the north and the defending champions of the Canadian Dog Derby. These intelligent dogs know the way and love to sled fast on a cold arctic winter day. In the evening, hotel pick up and transfer to Aurora Village, where you can stay at heated tee-pee to relax whilst waiting for Aurora to come and dance your night away.

### **Day 4 Yellowknife – Great Slave Ice Fishing – Aurora Viewing at Cabin (B)**

Enjoy an arctic experience ice fishing on one of the largest lakes in Canada. A safety briefing and demonstration of proper use of equipment follows. Sit back if you wish and watch your reel as you are on your journey to capture one hungry fish. A light fish lunch provided afterwards in heated fishing tents. Reel in your catch from The Great Slave Lake, the second-largest lake in the Northwest Territories of Canada. In the evening, hotel pick up and transfer to an aboriginal cabin, where you can stay in relax whilst waiting for Aurora to come again.
